ManufactureREADY is not for everyone. You are expected to attend Monday through Friday for six consecutive weeks. The program and its instructors requires very strict attendance.

THERE IS NO COST FOR ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS.

Taught through the Economic Development Services Division at Athens Technical College, the program is funded through the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) and the Northeast Georgia Regional Commission (NEGRC). ManufactureREADY is geared towards unemployed individuals who have little or no manufacturing experience, but who wish to reenter the workforce with new and in-demand skills. The program fee and all required materials are covered for those who meet eligibility requirements.

Application & Program Information

Program Requirements:

- Must be currently unemployed.
- Must have reading and basic math skills at an 8th grade level.
- 100% attendance is required to complete this six-week program. You must be on time every day. Being at work and on time is part of your job training. Attendance records will be part of the course records and provided to prospective employers.
- Must possess a high school diploma or GED.
- Must be willing and able to work full time in a manufacturing environment upon completion of this program. This includes the ability to stand or sit for long periods of time, and work holidays, weekends, and /or night shifts. Reliable transportation to/from class and work is required.
- Must be willing to provide contact information during the program and for three months following the close of the program. This is for job placement and follow-up required for funding.
- Athens Technical College is a smoke free and drug free campus. Manufacturers require drug screenings and physicals as part of their hiring process.

Program Provider: The program is provided by Athens Technical College.

Program Locations: Athens Technical College: Athens Campus, Greene County Campus, Walton County Campus

Program Schedule: A complete schedule with locations will be provided upon acceptance into the program.

Program Days & Times: Monday-Friday, 8am-4pm for six consecutive weeks. Schedule includes a 30 minute lunch break. Lunch is not provided. Schedules are subject to change and students will be notified of any changes to the schedule, though an announcement may not be made until the morning of class.

Educational Requirements:

TABE Results Required. Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE) is available at no cost.

Attendance & Dress: Attendance at all class sections is required (100% attendance) and you must be on time every day. The purpose of this program is to assist participants in obtaining full-time employment, and participants will be expected to dress appropriately for a manufacturing environment.
